**1.5** Million Jewish children were killed during the Holocaust. The **Every Child Has A Name Legacy Project** will remember these children through research and creative thought.

## When?

**Project Start:** December 2, 2019 | **Submission Deadline** May 8, 2020

## How?

1. Visit the **Yad Vashem Central Database of Shoah Victim's Names**
2. Go to Advanced Search
3. Search for a child murdered during the Holocaust by entering a year of birth between 1929 and 1940
4. Select a child's name to learn more about him/her, including birth place, place of death, and more
5. Use the **United States Holocaust Memorial Museum's Encyclopedia of the Holocaust** to research your selected child's place of birth, place of death, and other locations on his/her record
6. Create an artwork, poem, creative narrative, essay or other work inspired by the life and death of your selected child. Your work should be guided by the following questions:  
*Why did you select this child? How did this child inspire you? Why does this child need to be remembered? What can we learn from this child's short life?*

## Requirements

- Must be an original project based on individual research of a child murdered in the Holocaust
- Must be on 8.5" x 11" paper

## Judging & Awards

Entries will be judged using a rubric based on artistry, creativity, originality, quality, and overall impact. The creators of two middle school (6-8) and two high school (9-12) projects will be honored at a special ceremony at the Museum in June 2020.
