Education Outreach Programs

The Education Team provides 5 interactive outreach programs with one of our Museum Educators that can be brought to the classroom.

<u>Distance Learning Programs:</u> If your school district closes, we can offer the following programs to teachers virtually and provide links for the students to connect with our Education Team at home.

- Lecture with an Educator: A time will be arranged with the teacher for our Education Team to video conference (Zoom into the classroom or other connection point, ex. student's device at home) and give a 1-hour presentation on a specific topic. The presentation will conclude with a 15-minute Q&A session. Available topics:
 - Being an Upstander in Holocaust and American History (groups grade 6-12)
 - Holocaust History 101 (any group grade 6+ and adult groups)
 - 10 Stages of Genocide (grades 9+ and adult groups)
- **Be Your Own Curator**: The teacher will receive a digital packet of photos and instructions to print at school and have ready for the program. A time will be set up with the teacher for our Education Team to video conference (Zoom) into the classroom and virtually run the 'Be Your Own Curator' interactive classroom program. This program starts with a short overview of our Holocaust/Shoah wing and then has students curate their own mini poster exhibition using 20 photos from Holocaust history.
- Virtual Exhibition Tour: A time will be set up with the teacher for our Education Team to video conference (Zoom) into the classroom to do a virtual tour of the exhibition using film and photographs from the exhibition. In advance, the teacher will receive a digital copy of a student worksheet to print for the students. Students will fill out this worksheet during the virtual tour to stay focused. The virtual tour will conclude with a 15-minute Q&A session.

At School Classroom Kit Programs:

- Artifact Interaction Learning Kit: The school receives an artifact kit that includes replicas of documents and objects from our archive, disinfecting archival grade spray, and student worksheets. This kit is for one-day use to be delivered and picked up by Museum staff at the school's front desk. A time will be set up with the lead teacher for our Education or Archival Team to video conference (Zoom) into the classroom and virtually run the artifact interaction program.
- **10 Stages of Genocide Learning Kit:** The school receives a 10 Stages of Genocide kit that includes a class set of the 10 Stages of Genocide graphic novel sets, student activity sheets for group discussion, and 10 Stages of Genocide poster set for the classroom. This kit is for one- or two-day use to be delivered and picked up by Museum staff at the school's front desk. A time will be set up with the lead teacher for our Education Team to video conference (Zoom) into the classroom and virtually run the 10 Stages of Genocide interactive classroom program.
