

Education Outreach Programs (for teachers with student groups)

The Education Team provides interactive outreach programs for student groups with one of our Museum Educators that can be brought to your classroom. Note: Lecture and Book Club programs can also be done with your classes at home.

Lecture with an Educator:

A time will be arranged with the teacher for our Education Team to video conference (Zoom into the classroom or other connection point, ex. student's device at home) and give a 1-hour presentation on a specific topic. The presentation will conclude with a 15-minute Q&A session. Available topics:

- Being an Upstander in Holocaust and American History (grades 6-12)
- Holocaust History 101 (grades 6+ and adult groups)
- 10 Stages of Genocide (grades 9+ and adult groups)
- What are human rights? (grades 6-12)

Virtual Book Club:

A time will be arranged with the teacher for our Education Team to video conference (Zoom into the classroom or other connection point, ex. student's device at home) and hold an interactive book discussion. Our team will highlight major literary themes and historical facts. Available book discussions:

- The Diary of a Young Girl by Anne Frank (grades 5 to 8)
- Number the Stars by Lois Lowry (grades 5 and 6)
- The Book Thief by Markus Zusak (grades 8+)
- Night by Elie Wiesel (grades 9+ and adult groups)
- 10 Stages of Genocide Graphic Novels by Dallas Holocaust and Human Rights Museum (grades 9+ and adult groups)

Be Your Own Curator:

The teacher will receive a digital packet of photos and instructions to print at school and have ready for the program. A time will be set up with the teacher for our Education Team to video conference (Zoom) into the classroom and virtually run the 'Be Your Own Curator' interactive classroom program. This program starts with a short overview of our Holocaust/Shoah wing and then has students curate their own mini poster exhibition using 20 photos from Holocaust history.

Exhibition Highlights:

A time will be set up with the teacher for our Education Team to video conference (Zoom) into the classroom to do a highlights tour of the exhibition using film and photographs from the exhibition. Teachers can request topics that they would like their tour to focus on. Before the program, the teacher will receive a digital copy of a student worksheet to print for the students. Students will fill out this worksheet during the virtual tour to stay focused. The virtual tour will conclude with a 15-minute Q&A session.
