#### Instructions

1. Visit the Yad Vashem Central Database of Shoah Victim's Names.

- 2. Go to Advanced Search.
- **3.** Search for a child by entering a year of birth between 1929 and 1940. Then, under *Victim's Fate*, select *murdered*.
- 4. Select a child's name to learn more about them, including birth place and place of death.

#### 5. Use the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum's Encyclopedia of the Holocaust to further

research your selected child's place of birth, place of death, and other locations on their record.

**6.** Create a project. Projects may include but are not limited to: visual or performing arts, a work of literature such as a poem, creative narrative, essay, or others works of art inspired by your selected child.

#### Criteria

- Must be submitted online in PDF format to: https://dhhrm.formstack.com/forms/2022\_2023\_echn
- Must be an original project based on individual research of a child murdered in the Holocaust.
- Must fit on 8.5" x 11" paper.
- Your work should be guided by the following questions:
  - Why did you select this child? Why does this child need to be remembered?
    - What can we learn from this child's short life?
- Entries will be judged using a **rubric** based on artistry, creativity, originality, level of demonstrated research, and overall impact.

#### Selected projects will be honored at a ceremony in 2023.
