## MUSEUM POLICIES

- Upon entry, all visitors must pass through metal detectors and have all their belongings scanned and or searched.
- Armed law-enforcement personnel must identify themselves to Museum security officers prior to entry.
- Aerosols, flammable liquids, pepper spray, and mace are not permitted in the Museum.
- Knives with blades lengths of more than 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches are not permitted in the Museum.
- Eating, drinking are only permitted in designated areas of the Museum.
- Smoking is not permitted in or within 15 feet of the Museum.
- Photography, for personal use only, is permitted in the exhibitions. Flash photography is not permitted.
- Video and audio recording, for personal use only, are permitted in the Museum.
- The regulations governing the Museum's buildings and grounds are available at the Guest Services Desk.
- Service animals, as defined by the ADA, are welcome.

## GUNS OF NON-LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONS FORBIDDEN IN THE MUSEUM.

PURSUANT TO SECTION 30.06, PENAL CODE (TRESPASS BY LICENSE HOLDER WITH A CONCEALED HANDGUN), A PERSON LICENSED UNDER SUBCHAPTER H, CHAPTER 411, GOVERNMENT CODE (HANDGUN LICENSING LAW), MAY NOT ENTER THIS PROPERTY WITH A CONCEALED HANDGUN.

PURSUANT TO SECTION 30.07, PENAL CODE (TRESPASS BY LICENSE HOLDER WITH AN OPENLY CARRIED HANDGUN), A PERSON LICENSED UNDER SUBCHAPTER H, CHAPTER 411, GOVERNMENT CODE (HANDGUN).
