Upstander Institute: Upstanders in Action is a weeklong, hybrid institute for students entering 9th-12th grades. Students will explore the concept of Upstanders as leaders by exploring various historical Upstanders and how their leadership helped to combat injustice. After studying Upstanders in the Holocaust and human and civil rights movements, students create a 10-minute presentation on how they can use their leadership and Upstander skills to identify and help solve a problem in their own communities. About Upstanders in Action:

Upstander Institute: History in Focus is a weeklong, hybrid summer camp for students entering 7th-8th grades. Students will be introduced to the study of history through the lens of artifacts, primary sources, and testimonies. Throughout the week, students will explore the Holocaust, human, and civil rights in order to better understand how and why history is studied and interpreted. Students will then conduct research on a historical topic of their choice, culminating in the creation of a small exhibit panel about their chosen topic.
